Climate Change and the Economy

An article in Eureka Street by David James argues that the reaction of major investors and asset managers to climate change, will shape how we set up the monetary systems, which in turn determines what kind of society we have.

"A shift is afoot in the west's financial markets that represents the most important economic change since the emergence of the new financial instruments in the 1990s that ultimately led to the global financial crisis. It is the embrace of climate change by many of the world's biggest financial players. It is likely to result in a new way of thinking about money, which will change the substructure of developed economies.

The enormity of what is occurring has been sketched out by the governor of the Bank of England, Mark Carney. He <u>referred</u> to 'an estimated \$US90 trillion of infrastructure investment expected between 2015 and 2030' in which 'nearly 95 per cent of electricity supply will need to be low carbon, 70 per cent of new cars electric, and the CO2 intensity of the building sector will need to fall by 80 per cent'.

When Carney talks of 'new finance for a new economy', it points to how developed societies are about to change. Developing sustainable, non-polluting systems is a powerful imperative but the risks are high. As the poet Ezra Pound <u>observed</u>, if a culture gets money wrong, it gets everything wrong."
