St Bakhita's feast day is 8 February and to mark that occasion there is a day of prayer for Victims of Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking.

ACRATH (Australian Catholic Religious Against Human Trafficking) have a some very good ideas that you might like to consider to commemorate the day. For example, with Easter just around the corner, you might like to consider ethical slavery free chocolate eggs and bunnies!

Slavery-Free Easter



Be a Good Egg This Easter

Slavery-free chocolate tastes delicious. Apart from the great taste, it also means that no enslaved child has been used in the production of the chocolate.

You can buy slavery-free chocolate in big supermarkets and smaller shops. The easiest way to tell if your chocolate is

slavery-free is to check if it has one of these commonly used certification symbols on the wrapping:



Why

Children as young as 12 years old are picking cocoa beans in West Africa that are used in the chocolate we eat. Some of these children are trafficked and taken away from their families. Most are forced to pick cocoa from an early age for low, or no wages, for long hours, in dangerous working conditions and without any possibility of attending school.

Most of these children will never taste chocolate.

And it doesn't need to be Easter. You can join with millions of people around the world who happily now buy and eat only slavery-free chocolate. You can do these things:

- Buy only slavery-free Easter chocolate
- Talk about slavery-free chocolate tell five friends or family members that you have converted to slavery-free chocolate


These are difficult times - with a lot of calls on our generosity. Whatever way you are able to support people seeking asylum is much appreciated.
