From Fr Peter's Desk....

Sometimes we are too busy. We would be better to be silent, to be listening, to be wondering, to be adoring in the presence of God.

A Woman's Liberation (And maybe a Man's too)

Some weeks ago we sent out a call for Shopper's trolleys. You know, the wheelie shoppers we used to associate with our Grandmothers. After a while, the call was answered and over 10 were delivered to JRS. To those of us who use our cars to haul home the shopping, or can walk to shops nearby, any time of day or night, a trolley might seem a trifling thing.



Please reflect for a brief moment.....you live in a flat in Fairfield, or Bankstown. You have no car, your only live in child works 8am till 6pm, you have no-one to take you shopping for your supplies for yourself, your sick husband/ wife.

A shoppers' trolley is a liberating item. Instead of shopping everyday, it can be done once or twice a week. If you are dependent on Foodbank and other agencies, a visit when the shelves are well stocked might mean that you have more choice. Maybe toilet paper as well as rice, washing powder as well as canned beans. Thank you to all who helped to make these humble and so useful items available to some more families.

Are you a Fabric Tragic?

Do you have too many fabrics? Have you run out of storage? Maybe someone has just given you some and you don't have any need for them. Well the answer is just on your doorstep. You can **donate fabrics** and other sewing and craft items to a charity called <u>"The Sewing Basket"</u> at 450 Darling Street (cnr Elliot Street) Balmain.

Not only can you donate but **you can also buy fabrics** and haberdashery at the Sewing Basket. The shop has a wide range of fabrics and patterns, patchwork, embroidery materials, knitting and crochet yarn, haberdashery, and much more.

The Sewing Basket was established to provide **employment opportunities for people with a disability**. At the shop a team of experienced volunteers from the community work alongside the people they support. This provides people with disability the opportunity to learn a valuable job and interpersonal skills and encourages social inclusion in the community.


All stock at The Sewing Basket is donated by the community, which means you'll have a **sustainable shopping experience** and End a large variety of unique and vintage materials.
