Here in Australia they care for refugees and people seeking asylum by promoting their physical wellbeing with food, clothing and shelter, and their legal and emotional needs through casework support. At our last Social Justice Group meeting we reflected on the sobering fact, presented in Laudato Si by Pope Francis, that it is the marginalised who will suffer most from climate change - bushfires, drought... and from epidemics like coronavirus. As part of the team that deliver our donations to JRS at Westmead, I can tell you that we all make an incredible difference to people seeking asylum. Spotlight on Aboriginal issues

This week marks the first anniversary of Deacon Boniface Perdjert's death (18 March), a respected Elder and the first Aboriginal permanent deacon. In honour of his anniversary, let us reflect on these words that he wrote in the late 1970s:

"God did not begin to take an interest in people with the incarnation of his Son, nor with Abraham. My people existed here in Australia thousands of years before Abraham. In all that time God was with my people. He worked through their culture. He was saving us despite human weakness. He was preparing us for the day when he would see the f eatures of Aboriginals in the image of his Son. So I must recognise, I must use the things of God that are in my culture. I must use them in his service. If I do not do this, my faith and my service are shallow. They are pretending. They belong to someone else, not to me.

God has asked us to love him with whole mind, heart and soul. So I must give myself to God as an Aboriginal. This is what God wants or he would not have made me what I am".



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
