*Week of Solidarity with the People Struggling against Racism and Racial Discrimination (Saturday, March 21 - Friday, March 27). This week recognises the importance of communities and nations to strive towards racial equality and tolerance.

It begins with International Day for Elimination of Racial Discrimination on Saturday, March 21. I wonder how far we've come in recognising and addressing racism since the Mabo decision in 1992?

*Abolition of the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Commission (ATSIC) Monday, March 23. Perhaps this day could be an opportunity for us to reflect on the place of elected Indigenous representative bodies in the Australian political system.

Walk for Wilai, an Australian Camino that retraces the steps of Mary MacKillop from Portland, Victoria to Penola, South Australia. This is a significant fundraising event for the Wilai Foundation Ltd, which is a registered Australian charity that seeks to raise awareness of statelessness and offer support to stateless, orphaned girls in Thailand and Myanmar.
