The anniversary of the Appin Massacre (April 17, 2016) recently took place. The massacre was the culmination of a military reprisal raid ordered by Governor Lachlan Macquarie against Aborigines in the western part of Sydney. The death toll is unknown, but 14 bodies, of men, women and children were recovered from Appin Gorge. A group of Aborigines camped nearby had been attacked during the night and either shot or driven over the steep cliffs of the gorge.

Although this incident is often claimed to be the end of the Cumberland Plain war, violence and killings on both sides continued through 1816 until most Aboriginal warriors were either killed or exiled, after which Macquarie declared a general amnesty. Since 2000 this massacre has been commemorated at

Cataract Dam. As the plaque there says; We acknowledge the impact this had on the Aboriginal people of this land. We are deeply sorry. We will remember them.



Why not include everyone?

My people are suffering... This virus doesn't look at your visa... why are we looking at people's visas to decide if they can get help? Sajeda, Rohingyan community leader.

As the COVID-19 pandemic tightens its grip, it is clear that thousands of temporary visa holders, including people seeking protection, are suffering deeply and need our help.

The Justice and Peace Office of the Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney, the Diocese of Parramatta and JRS Australia co-organised a private letter from 44 Catholic leaders, including four Bishops, more than ten Congregational leaders, and CEOs of key national Catholic health and social services to support everyone on temporary visas.

Catholics for Refugees have started a petition asking for State and Federal governments to extend a vital safety net – financial support, Medicare and adequate shelter to everyone in need within the Australian

community- regardless of their visa status, during the COVID_19 pandemic.

As Sister Susan Connolly writes about Collaery, "...a man who honours his conscience...is found to be ripe for victimisation. Condemnation, secrecy, procedural delay and the spinning of myths to cover **flagrant abuse of power** (my emphasis) is his lot. Is he destined for jail? Who knows? Perhaps the

powers that be will be satisfied with attempting to crush him, personally and professionally".
