Spotlight on Aboriginal issues:

This week in 1997 saw the introduction of the Howard Government's Ten Point Plan in response to the Wik Decision of 1996. The decision was made by the High Court of Australia and was a case between the Wik Peoples and State of Queensland. It found that Native Title was not extinguished as a result of pastoral leases to farmers and other private owners of land. In other words, regardless of who financially owned the land, Native Title could not be lost by the Indigenous populations. The response by the Howard Government was controversial and in its view was designed to "return the pendulum to the centre" with regards to "Native Title and security for pastoralists, farmers and miners" (PM, John Howard).



Laudato Si Week (16 – 24 May)

Catholics everywhere are invited to unite in solidarity for a more just and sustainable future for our world.

From Laudato Si:

...it is not possible to sustain the present level of consumption in developed countries and wealthier sectors of society, where the habit of consumption and waste has reached unprecedented levels.

About food waste:

Did you know that about one third of the world's food gets wasted? Wasting food also wastes the resources used to produce it – water, land, energy, labour, money and love. Here's some good advice from OzHarvest about what we might consider doing to reduce our own waste:

- Check the fridge, freezer and pantry before shopping for items already there, and which of those need using up.
- Know the difference between "Best Before" and "Use By". Best Before" refers to quality. It's perfectly safe to eat past the date. "Used By" refers to food safety. Food can still be edible past the date, but use your senses to gauge whether it remains so.
- Plan meals (and stick to the plan) based on:
 - \Rightarrow Who is home this week
 - ⇒ How many meals to prepare
 - \Rightarrow What food needs using up
 - ⇒ Including a "Leftovers Night"

NB: Write a list of what is needed.

I've had to develop some interesting strategies to avoid bikes, joggers, scooters... the quick sidestep onto the grass is my most creative move in maintaining social distance. One thing I've noticed is families out together walking, or riding bikes along the path. And it's always been good to see neighbours or people from church along the

But I'm not only out walking for the exercise. I've been a birder for many years, and so I always keep my eyes open for our feathered friends. Right now the Yellow-faced Honeyeater migration is underway, and every now and then small groups pass over. Whistlers and Fantails have now arrived to spend the winter along the GreenWay. Recently a sea eagle flew up the canal, hotly pursued by the local ravens and miners (the local louts, according to Fay). I wondered whether I was the only one who seemed to notice all the commotion. Last Tuesday I spotted two Little Lorikeets in Murden Reserve. A good find.... my first sighting of these birds in my local patch since we moved here three years ago. Who knows who and what you might see along the GreenWay!
