With the relaxation of isolation measures and the approach of winter, an increase in cases is expected. Clergy and faithful are therefore encouraged to download the CovidSafe App and abide by the latest public health advisories.

The Archdiocese of Sydney recognises that staying safe online is something many adults, children and young people are concerned about. Technology is changing now more than ever, it is important 💆 that we can remain aware of potential online challenges and equip ourselves with the tools we need to protect not only ourselves online but children and young people. In light of the current situation, more research has been conducted about the risks and challenges that children and young peo-

ple face online, according to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, ninety-seven per cent of households with children aged under 15 years have access to the internet, with an average number of seven devices per household, ninety-nine per cent of young people aged 15 - 17 years are online averaging 18 hours per week of online activity.

The Safeguarding Office wants to develop resources that will provide adults, children and young people with the knowledge and skills to help keep them safe online. We are turning towards our parish communities for help to roll out this great initiative, we have developed a 5 minute CyberSafety Survey for adults and chil**dren to complete** that will enable us to gain a better understanding about the knowledge adults, children and young people have about eSafety as well as develop resources that are targeted the needs of our Archdiocese community.

The survey is anonymous and will only take 5 minutes to complete, very quick and easy. We are encouraging as many people as possible to get involved, you don't have to have children in order to participate in the survey. The questions have been designed to be fun and gauge an individuals basic understanding of eSafety. # Supporting the Jesuit Refugee Services (JRS)

Last week Dave and I took part in a Webinar from JRS. We heard from three staff members what the conditions for people seeking asylum are now in this COVID-19 environment. We heard firsthand about the desperation many are facing just to provide basic needs.

The first workers laid off were in industries where most migrant, refugees and people seeking asylum workers are able to find work, such as the hospitality and service sectors. Many, indeed most, of them are ineligible for JobKeeper or JobSeeker payments. The calls on JRS and other charities/agencies for help have therefore risen dramatically - in April JRS added an additional 100 families to their Foodbank list. They are struggling to meet these increased demands for rental assistance and food, and more than ever need our support.

## Foodbank stocks urgently needed:



Basmati rice, cooking oil, long life milk, tinned tuna, red kidney beans, lentils, chick peas, canned tomatoes, oats and cereal, and toiletry items such as soap and toothpaste.

Please leave donations at the Parish Office on Tuesday, Wednesday or Thursday 10:00am – 2:00pm. One of our team will make sure they get to the JRS Centre at Westmead.

We know it's hard to shop at the moment, so **cash donations** might be easier.

Next week is a big week for Australian Indigenous issues. The 26th of May recognises National Sorry Day, the 1997 tabling of the 'Bring Them Home Report' in the Federal Parliament, and the 2017 release of the 'Uluru Statement from the Heart'. The 27th of May commences National Reconciliation Week and is the anniversary of the 1967 Referendum which recognised Aboriginal people in the Australian census. May 28 marks the day over 250,000 people walked for reconciliation in 2000 and May 29 marks 28 years since the launch of the Torres Strait Islander flag in 1992.
