# From Fr Peter's Desk....

*As you are have probably heard in the media, the* NSW State Government has now given permission for Churches to begin services with a maximum of 50 people, provided there is 4 square metres around each person, records of attendees are kept, hand washing and surface cleansing is carried out between services and all possible precautions are taken to prevent any further contagion. I am aware that we are all anxious to return to Mass. none more so than myself. However, after consultation with Parish Staff and archdiocesan advice, we have decided not to recommence Sunday Masses at this time. This decision has been reached for a number of reasons with regard to our particular circumstances. *Of course, our number one priority is the health of* our people and to this end we wish to err on the safe side. Having said that, the government initiative in this regard takes no cognisance of the size or design of the place of worship. 50 people in St Mary's *Cathedral or many parish churches would be easily* achieved given the above conditions; not so at St Columba's. Getting out my tape measure, it seems unlikely we could accommodate 50 with 4 square metres around each, the rear pews are only accessible from one end meaning that every second seat could accommodate 1 person or perhaps family only. Added to this, access to the pews is via a very narrow aisle in which people could not pass whilst maintaining social distancing which is especially problematic for distribution of Communion as well as entering and leaving the Church. There are of course further complications in terms of cleaning and other logistics which are beyond our resources at the moment to guarantee. I trust you understand the reasons for this decision

and we all look forward to a realistic and practical recommencement of Masses. Friday morning Mass at 9.15am is available after registering with Marcia in the Parish office. In the mean time I shall continue the weekly podcasts and urge you to follow the bulletin, website and FaceBook for updates. Take care and go gently with yourselves and each other.

The Archdiocese of Sydney recognises that staying safe online is something many adults, children and young people are concerned about. Technology is changing now more than ever, it is important that we can remain aware of potential online challenges and equip ourselves with the tools we need to protect not only ourselves online but children and young people. In light of the current situation, more research has been conducted about

the risks and challenges that children and young people face online, according to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, ninety-seven per cent of households with children aged under 15 years have access to the internet, with an average number of seven devices per household, ninety-nine per cent of young people aged 15 - 17 years are online averaging 18 hours per week of online activity.

The Safeguarding Office wants to develop resources that will provide adults, children and young people with the knowledge and skills to help keep them safe online. We are turning towards our parish communities for help to roll out this great initiative, we have developed a **5 minute CyberSafety Survey for adults and** 

**children to complete** that will enable us to gain a better understanding about the knowledge adults, children and young people have about eSafety as well as develop resources that are targeted the needs of our Archdiocese community.

The survey is anonymous and **will only take 5 minutes to complete, very quick and easy. We are encouraging as many people as possible to get involved, you don't have to have children in order to participate in the survey.** The questions have been designed to be fun and gauge an individuals basic understanding of eSafety. ## Time for nature

"The foods we eat, the air we breathe, the water we drink and the climate that makes our planet habitable all come from nature. For instance, each year, marine plants produce more than a half of our atmosphere's oxygen, and a mature tree cleans our air, absorbing 22 kilos of carbon dioxide, releasing oxygen in exchange. Despite all the benefits that our nature give us, we still mistreat it. That is why we need to work on that. That is why we need this Observance.

World Environment Day is the most renowned day for environmental action. Since <u>1974</u>, it has been celebrated every year on 5 June: engaging governments, businesses, celebrities and citizens to focus their efforts on a pressing environmental issue.

In 2020, the **theme is biodiversity** – a concern that is both urgent and existential. Recent events, from bushfires in Brazil, the United States, and Australia to locust infestations across East Africa – and now, a global disease pandemic – demonstrate the interdependence of humans and the webs of life, in which they exist". ## **Spotlight on Aboriginal Issues**

May 25th, 2020. This is the date George Floyd, an African-American man died in the custody of police officers in Minneapolis, United States. Four police officers have been charged with his murder. The death of George stirred a broken nation. People of all colours and political persuasions took to the streets in over 146 cities across the the United States to protest another death of an African-American person at the hands of police.

Sadly this event also reminds us the need for us as a society to acknowledge the widespread discrimination and racism experienced by people within our Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. The Uluru Statement from the Heart was released on May 26th, 2017 in an attempt to acknowledge the traditional owners of Australian land and their place within modern-day Australia. The Statement proposes constitutional change recognising the existence of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people as well as the establishment of the Makarrata Commission designed to oversee a process of truth-telling about Australia's history and colonisation. 
