We will then respond to people, with confirmation of attendance. If people don't hear back from the parish by midday Thursday, they are welcome to apply again for the following week.

The Archdiocese of Sydney recognises that staying safe online is something many adults, children and young people are concerned about. Technology is changing now more than ever, it is important that we can remain aware of potential online challenges and equip ourselves with the tools we need to protect not only ourselves online but children and young people. In light of the current situation, more research has been conducted about

the risks and challenges that children and young people face online, according to the Australian Bureau of Statistics, ninety-seven per cent of households with children aged under 15 years have access to the internet, with an average number of seven devices per household, ninety-nine per cent of young people aged 15 - 17 years are online averaging 18 hours per week of online activity.

The Safeguarding Office wants to develop resources that will provide adults, children and young people with the knowledge and skills to help keep them safe online. We are turning towards our parish communities for help to roll out this great initiative, we have developed a 5 minute CyberSafety Survey for adults and

children to complete that will enable us to gain a better understanding about the knowledge adults, children and young people have about eSafety as well as develop resources that are targeted the needs of our Archdiocese community.

The survey is anonymous and will only take 5 minutes to complete, very quick and easy. We are encouraging as many people as possible to get involved, you don't have to have children in order to participate in the survey. The questions have been designed to be fun and gauge an individuals basic understanding of eSafety. Join this webinar to hear about the impact the change to the JobSeeker rate has had on people's lives, and take part in the conversation about 'building back better' in Australia's medium to longer term responses to the current pandemic.

For years Vinnies joined many other organisations in calling on the Federal Government to raise the rate of Newstart. The introduction of the Coronavirus Supplement has lifted many welfare recipients above the poverty line for the first time in decades. However, it is only guaranteed for six months. What will happen next?

Closing the gap between Indigenous and non-indigenous Australians has been a goal and focus of the Australian Government for the past couple of decades. Achieving this however has been more than difficult. According to <u>Australians Together.org</u>:

Between 2014-2016, Indigenous children aged 0-4 were more than twice as likely to die than non-Indigenous children. In the Northern Territory, Indigenous infant mortality was 4 times higher than the national rate.

# From birth, Indigenous Australians have a lower life expectancy than non-Indigenous Australians:

Non-Indigenous girls born in 2010-2012 in Australia can expect to live a decade longer than Indigenous girls born the same year (84.3 years and 73.7 years respectively).

The gap for men is even larger, with a 69.1 years life expectancy for Indigenous men and 79.9 years for non-

Indigenous men.

Indigenous women also experience approximately double the level of maternal mortality in 2016.

Similar gaps exist in areas of education and employment, physical and mental health, incarceration, and family and community wellbeing.
