### **Bernard Collaery Update**

The Bernard Collaery/Witness K situation has been in the media a lot recently, at least in certain sections of the media that value free speech and the rule of law. The reason for the media attention was the secret pre-trial hearing to determine if the government's prosecution of Bernard Collaery could be held in secret. It turns out that it can be, or at least most of it can be. Our National Security Information Act says that the judge had to give most weight to what the Attorney-General says, even when the issue is not really national security but the protection of the government, in particular John Howard, Alexander Downer and David Irvine (then Head of ASIS), from embarrassment, or worse.

Why is the Australian bugging of the Timor-Leste cabinet offices, that has led to the prosecution of Collaery and Witness K, a social justice issue? Simply because a large, rich nation should not be allowed to commit fraud against a small, impoverished nation and get away with it.

### ABORIGINAL AND TORRES STRAIT ISLANDER SUNDAY: PODCAST

Hello everyone. This podcast has been prepared by Steve Pardey and Fay Hair from the Indigenous issues sub group of the St Columba's Social Justice Group. It tries to explain two things - the significance of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday and why we make an Acknowledgement of Country.

### **Acknowledgement of Country**

As this podcast begins, on behalf of our group, I wish to acknowledge the traditional custodians who have walked upon and cared for the lands upon which we are each located.. We acknowledge the continued deep spiritual attachment and relationship of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples to this country and we commit ourselves to the ongoing journey of Reconciliation.

You might be wondering just exactly what Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Sunday is, and how it fits in with our Catholic Church?

Did you know that there are over 130,000 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics in Australia? And it's a group that's growing strongly. The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council, known as NATSICC, represents these Indigenous Catholics. Today, Sunday July 5<sup>th</sup>, is the day that NATSICC invites us all to celebrate the gifts of spirituality and culture that Indigenous Catholics bring to the Australian church.

The culture, beliefs and practices of Indigenous people are rich in spirituality. To fully understand this, we really should draw on Indigenous leaders themselves. I cannot do it justice. What I have come to learn, though, is that Aboriginal Spirituality is the very core of Aboriginal being, their very identity. It gives meaning to all aspects of life. It is based on the ancestral tie between the land and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and so includes a deep respect for relationships with each other and with the environment...

Today we acknowledge that God has been walking with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, making his presence known through a continuous living culture over many thousands of years. We pray in thanksgiving for these ancient peoples who have enriched and sustained our continent over all that time. And we praise God for the people who nurtured the land here in this Parish that we call home.

Pope John Paul 11 expresses the significance of Indigenous spirituality to our Catholic faith in his address at Alice Springs in 1986. He said, "It is a great joy for me to be here today in Alice Springs and to meet so many of you, the Aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders of Australia. "You are part of Australia and Australia is a part of you. And the Church herself in Australia will not be fully the Church that Jesus wants her to be until you have made your contribution to her life and until that contribution has been joyfully received by others."

Steve sees Aboriginal Spirituality as giving meaning to all aspects of life including relationships with one another and the environment. All objects are living and share the same soul and spirit. There is also great kinship with the land.

### Significance of Acknowledgment of Country

Acknowledgement of country is a way that all people can show awareness and respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and heritage and the ongoing relationship the Traditional custodians have with the land. Both Indigenous and Non-indigenous can perform Acknowledgement of Country. It is a demonstration of respect dedicated to the traditional Custodians of the land (or sea) where an event is taking place. Significance of Acknowledgment of Country

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232 years ago, English settlement started in Australia.

What dire consequences would start to unfold as Aborigines were dispossessed of their land! What's happened to their culture, their customs and traditions, their language, their lives? What part can we play in healing those hurts? How do we bring serenity and peace to those uprooted lives? There's so much that needs to be done. But, giving an Acknowledgement of Country before we start public events such as our Masses is a good starting point.

### **Concluding Prayer**

This prayer for Reconciliation was written by a small group of Aboriginal Elders and Reconciliation Church staff members in 2014

God of all creation,

As we journey together in this Great Southern Land,

we pray for healing, forgiveness and unity, creating a path of good will, with

justice and compassion.

Jesus, through the power of your love, You have given us the courage, wisdom and strength

to share our gifts and talents with humility.

In peace and understanding we reconcile with each other.

**Creator Spirit,** we come together in prayer and thanksgiving for the many blessings we have received.

Allow your spirit to wash over us and give us strength to walk together as one.
