Spotlight on Aboriginal Issues: The Aboriginal Land Rights Act

The Aboriginal Land Rights Act (ALRA) was passed into law by the NSW Parliament back in 1983. It was intended to form a part of crown-sponsored compensation towards Aboriginal communities and individuals who have been negatively impacted by the colonial era dispossession of their lands. According to the Aboriginal Affairs Department of the NSW Government, the ALRA is meant to "support Aboriginal communities' social and economic development" by enabling Aboriginal Land Councils to lay claim to land as a form of "compensation for historic dispossession".

Whilst the law enables Aboriginal Land Councils to lay claim to economically strategic land, it doesn't provide a time limit for how long the process can carry on for. According to Lorena Allam, a respected investigative journalist at The Guardian, there are currently over 37,000 unresolved Aboriginal land claims across NSW. This includes the first ever claim lodged in the State's history, back in 1984. Allam highlights a troubling trend when quoting the number of claims from back in 2011. At this point of the law's nearly 30-year history, only 3,685 claims had been approved within NSW, out of a total of 33,272.

That left 29,587 claims accumulated during this period marked as outstanding.

At the current point in time, the Aboriginal land claims awaiting processing have only increased and currently stand at over 37,000. James Christian, the Chief Executive of the Aboriginal Land Council, suggests that at the NSW Government's current rate of processing, this backlog will take approximately 100 years to process - causing Aboriginal groups and individuals to miss out on the economic opportunity intended as compensation for the historic dispossession experienced by themselves and broader Aboriginal communities.

The question of whether or not this is an acceptable situation for members of the NSW Aboriginal communities to be in is asked to all of us, Indigenous or not. I think most people would accept that this not an acceptable situation for the State of NSW to be in and therefore attention to this issue is vital for enhancing the rights of our Aboriginal brothers and sisters.
