Homelessness Week 2020

Last week, August 2-8, was Homelessness Week. For most of us our homes provide shelter, safety and security. The COVID-19 crisis has shown how important home is, and it has also shown how badly broken our housing system is.

Before COVID-19 almost 120,000 people were homeless in Australia every night. With the onset of the pandemic, a million or so Australians are currently unemployed with many facing the possibility of losing their home. We are indeed in the beginning of a housing crisis.

- Build 30,000 social housing units over a 4-year period
- Accelerate the maintenance and renovation of existing social housing stock.

Caring for Creation

Although September is Caring for Creation month, we thought caring for our common home is important all year round. Hence these few thoughts:

Five years ago Pope Francis issued his encyclical, Laudato Si, on care for our common home. Foremost, the encyclical encourages us to see all of creation as gift and in the words of Mary MacKillop, "... glimpses of the infinitely beautiful Creator". It stresses the urgency of care for creation and so issues such as climate change, consumerism and waste, are addressed.

We are all urged to take action. A good way to start is to make one simple commitment and then build on it. Examples could be cutting back on single use plastics, planning weekly menus to avoid food waste or monitoring how we use water. "In these times of the pandemic, in which we are more aware of the importance of care for our common home, I hope that all the common reflection and commitment may help to create and strengthen constructive attitudes for the care of creation". Like so many other Indigenous populations around the world, the impact of COVID-19 upon Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people here in Australia has been of great concern from the outset. The United Nations has the following to say about COVID-19 and the world's Indigenous populations:

"As we ght against the spread of the pandemic, it is more important than ever to safeguard indigenous peoples and their knowledge. Their territories are home to 80% of the world's biodiversity and they can teach us much about how to rebalance our relationship with nature and reduce the risk of future pan-

Indigenous peoples are seeking their own solutions to this pandemic. They are taking action and using traditional knowledge and practices such as voluntary isolation, and sealing off their territories, as well as preventive measures".




A message from the Archdiocese of Sydney

that as the prophet Isaiah entered your presence as if enfolded in a gentle breeze, so come to us


