## Social Justice - St Columba's

The first meeting in a while of the St Columba's Social Justice Group will be on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> September at 7:00pm in the Parish Hall. The Season of Creation is 1 September - 4 October. It's a time to renew our relationship with our Creator and with all creation. It unites the world's 2.2 billion Christians around one shared purpose. Check out the Global Catholic Climate Movement website for inspirational ideas and resources.

In his message to mark the start of Season of Creation, Pope Francis notes that 'Ithe pandemic has brought us to a crossroad". He says, "We must use this decisive moment to end our superfluous and destructive goals and activities, and to cultivate cultural values, connections and activities that are life-giving." "We must examine our habits of energy usage, consumption, transportation and, diet....".

One aspect of the Pope's call to care for creation is the preservation of biodiversity. Monday 7<sup>th</sup> September is National Threatened Species Day. The day is the anniversary of the death in Hobart Zoo of the last known Tasmanian Tiger. This anniversary reminds us of how many of our native birds and mammals we've lost since European settlement. We must try and save what's left!

Last weekend I was very fortunate to be on a boat off Kiama. At one point we were approached by a pod of whales that hung around the boat for about an hour. One whale was so close I could have almost have touched it. It was an amazing experience.

Even in Leichhardt we can experience the wonder and beauty of the natural world. Right now, for example, currawongs, wattlebirds, scrubwrens, magpies and miners are nesting. Just watching them collecting nesting material and foraging for their young is fascinating. This is why we must try to do whatever we can to care for creation. Our wildlife is worth it!

A message from the Indigenous Literacy Foundation: "Only 36% of Indigenous Year 5 students in very remote areas are at or above national minimum reading standards, compared to 96% for non-Indigenous students in major cities, according to the 2018 National Assessment Program for Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN).

The situation is improving but there is still a long way to go and the challenges are immense.

Apart from the historical, health, social, and educational disadvantage issues, many remote communities don't have many, if any, books"
