The Season of Creation: 1 September - 4 October.

Oh, what a wonderful time of the year! I love Spring. I love it because our days are longer... and warmer. I love seeing new shoots forming on plants, and flowers blossoming. I love being able to walk among the trees and watch birds nesting. For me it's very awe-inspiring as I look and wonder how living things "work". It all serves to give me hope as I see new life and beauty all around me. Seen like this, every living thing becomes a reminder of our Creator God.

Catholic Earthcare Australia: Convocation 2020. This series of webinars started last week and continues through September. It covers, from a Catholic perspective, our relationship with our common home. Recording of the sessions will be available shortly.

Insights we have gained so far include:

From Session 3 - There is a lot of common ground among all major religions about our relation with the world. Keynote speakers representing Islamic, Buddhist, Jewish, Indigenous and Christian backgrounds, spoke about the central place being connected to nature has on their faith practises. All saw nature as revealing something of the wonder of God Creator...

From Session 4 – There is hope that the decarbonisation of our economies will proceed quickly enough to avert the worst effects of climate change. Eminent economist Dr Ross Garnaut pointed out how much lower the costs of doing the things we must do to make energy production and transport carbon neutral have become in the last ten years or so. He was very satisfied with the progress in implementing the Paris Agreement.

What the hunter brings,


Now we work for money,


