Spotlight on Aboriginal issues: NAIDOC 2020, "Always Was, Always Will Be"

**"Budyeri kamaru"**: "Hello" in Gadigal language (the traditional custodians of which St. Columba's Parish has been built).

As reported last week, the theme for this year's NAI-DOC celebrations is "Always Was, Always Will Be".



What does this phrase actually mean though?

It reflects back upon 65,000+ years of love and care this continent of Australia has received from the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. It highlights the thousands of years of Aboriginal civilisation that flourished well before any European knowledge about the existence of this place.

The purpose of this year's NAIDOC theme being "Always Was, Always Will Be", is to remind all Australians of the rich history this land posses as well as the diverse cultures and achievements of our country's Aboriginal and Torres Strait Island peoples. It is to acknowledge our understanding that the history of this nation commenced well before European settlement and its documented contact.

This NAIDOC, lets all take a moment to listen to and learn about part of the 65,000+ year history this land is so privileged to have.
