Tuesday's state budget included \$812 million for about 1,300 additional social housing homes across NSW and upgrades to thousands of existing houses. But according to Vinnies, more than 51,000 families are waiting for social housing right now, and this number will only increase in coming years. Vinnies would like to see the social housing supply increased by 5,000 per year for the next ten years. What has been promised is nowhere near enough! 
