It inspires the will to live.


It is the doctor's most powerful ally.



Wednesday, December 2: International Day for the Abolition of Slavery

This is a good time to reflect on aspects of modernday slavery and how it's being addressed.

There's been a lot in the media lately about how much the price of fruit and vegetables will soon rise. This is because much of the current crop will be left in the ground or in the trees due to COVID-19 restrictions leading to a lack of pickers. Politicians in Canberra and some farmers' groups have been trying to blame unemployed Australians for this situation, accusing them of being too lazy to do farm work. But, perhaps Australian citizens are too aware of their rights to put up with being paid below-award rates and being forced to live in expensive substandard accommodation? Indeed, many ads for pickers stipulate backpackers only.

To me the take home message from all this is that we should all be prepared to pay more for our fruit and vegies so that those who do the harvesting receive a decent (legal) wage.

At the time a lot was made of the Commonwealth and NSW anti-slavery legislation that passed in 2018. Both Acts require companies above a certain income threshold to report on the risks of modern slavery in their operations and supply chains, and to say what actions they have taken to minimise these risks, and what the outcomes have been. The Federal Act is similar to the UK Act of 2015, which, according to The New Daily, has been a failure because a large percentage of companies have not reported as required.

Australian companies have not yet had to re port but a similar outcome is to be expected here because neither Act includes any meaningful sanctions for non-compliance. At least the NSW legislation provides for a penalty of up to \$1.1 million.

It is, however, a concern that the NSW Government will review the Act and "introduce necessary amendments ... to complement the Commonwealth Act and ... [that are] not inconsistent with it." In other words, the NSW Act will no longer include penalties. I think it's time we contacted our politicians to say we want this problem of modern-day slavery fixed properly. Thursday, December 3: International Day of Persons with Disabilities

like mental illness, chronic pain, sight or hearing impairments, diabetes and learning differences.

Spotlight on Aboriginal issues: Address of John Paul 11 at Alice Springs

On November 29, 1986 Pope John Paul II met with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in Alice Springs. Below is an excerpt of his speech. "Dear Brothers and Sisters,

It is a great joy for me to be here today in Alice Springs and to meet so many of you, the Aborigines and Torres Strait Islanders of Australia. I want to tell you right away how much the Church esteems and loves you, and how much she wishes to assist you in your spiritual and material needs.

At the beginning of time, as God's Spirit moved over the waters, he began to communicate something of his goodness and beauty to all creation.

When God then created man and woman, he gave them the good things of the earth for their use and benefit; and he put into their hearts abilities and powers, which were his gifts. And to all human beings throughout the ages God has given a desire for himself, a desire which different cultures have tried to express in their own ways.

As the human family spread over the face of the earth, your people settled and lived in this big country that stood apart from all the others. Other people did not even know this land was here; they only knew that somewhere in the southern oceans of the world there was "The Great South Land of the Holy Spirit". But for thousands of years you have lived in this land and fashioned a culture that endures to this day. And during all this time, the Spirit of God has been with you. Your "Dreaming", which influences your lives so strongly that, no matter what happens, you remain for ever people of your culture, is your only way of touching the mystery of God's Spirit in you and in creation. You must keep your striving for God and hold on to it in your lives".
