Coming up:

Thursday, December 10 is International Human Rights Day.

On this day in 1948 the United Nations General Assembly adopted and proclaimed the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. It was the first global enunciation of human rights and one of the first major achievements of the United Nations.

For me, obvious human rights relate to refugees and people seeking asylum, to people with disabilities, and to indigenous peoples. But there are many other, less evident, human rights. Last year's Social Justice Statement from the Australian Catholic Bishops, the one about "Genuine Human Encounter in our Digital World", had an interesting take on what could, and maybe should, be considered a newly evolved right digital inclusion. If, like me, you've ever struggled to deal online with government departments, you'll have

As the bishops say: "It is clear that social divisions are being replicated online. More worryingly, as essential services continue to shift online, digital inclusion becomes mandatory for basic participation in society. It should therefore be considered a human right. This is important in the context of e-government, where the welfare of the most vulnerable is at stake \(\bar{Y}\). In this situation think the injustice of Robodebt, think home schooling in the COVID-19 crisis where the home does not possess even a basic computer, and so much more.

Spotlight on Aboriginal issues: Sir Douglas Nicholls

Food for Thought

On December 1 1976 Sir Douglas Nicholls was appointed Governor of South Australia. He was the first Aboriginal Australian to be appointed to a vice-regal role within the country.


Aboriginal Victoria, a Victorian State Government Agency, speaks in depth about the person Sir Nicholls was and the contributions he made to Australian society over his many years of public life.

e achievements of Sir Douglas Nicholls are many and varied, taking in the fields of sport, politics and social justice. He broke new ground — as the first Indigenous Australian to receive a knighthood in 1972, and the first to be appointed to vice-regal office, when he became Governor of South Australia in 1976... He never shied away from exposing the realities of prejudice and inequality. By the end of his life in 1988, Sir Doug was credited with helping to return a sense of pride and hope to people who had lost both. That he enacted real change for the better is unquestionable and a statue in Parliament Gardens in Melbourne attests to his status as one of Australia's truly influential figures of the 20th century".


