Palm Sunday: There will be no procession this year. Please BYO Palm or Branches

Good Friday, Saturday Vigil and Easter Sunday: Will be held in the School Play Ground under a Marquee. Please BYO Chairs and Blankets. Entry will be like Christmas, through the main school gates using QR Code scanning.

March 21: International Day of Forests

- Proclaimed by the United Nations General Assembly in 2012 to celebrate and raise awareness of the importance of all types of trees
- •The theme for International Day of Forests for 2021 is "Forest restoration: a path to recovery and well-being. The theme fits in with the UN Decade on Ecosystem Restoration (2021 2030), a call for the protection and revival of ecosystems around the world.

Did you know

- Forests are home to about 80% of the world's terrestrial biodiversity, with more than 60,000 trees species
- Around 1.6 billion people depend directly on forests for food, shelter, energy, medicines and income
- The world is losing 10 million hectares of forest each year?

Pope Francis begins his Encyclical, Laudato Si, with a strong cry from the heart about the state of our Earth.... the harm we have caused by the irresponsible use and abuse of resources. He writes, "This is why the earth herself, burdened and laid waste, is among the most abandoned and maltreated of our poor $\dot{\phi}\bar{\Upsilon}$

Yes, we can see with our own eyes that the Earth is crying out - so many natural disasters and extreme weather events. In NSW in the last couple of years we've seen drought, fire, and currently major floods. They're said to be 1 in 50 or 1 in 100-year events. But climate scientists tell us that such events will become more common as the earth continues to warm.

What can we do? Its more than doing our bit by making small changes – consuming less, driving less, installing solar panels, and so on. They're all good but we are called to be immersed in creation, to love every bit of creation, to see ourselves as part of creation, not

not just as the lords and masters.... Pope Francis calls us to an ecological conversion. It will take this kind of conversion to enable real change ...

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Spotlight on Aboriginal Issues: The Vatican speaks on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples and the Mission of the Church

Pope Francis in Laudato Si calls us to "show special care for indigenous communities and their cultural traditions." He has expressed his desire "to be a spokesman for the deepest longings of indigenous peoples. And to cry out like a prophet about the fact that indigenous peoples continue to be threatened in their identity and even in their very existence".

In the Special Synod of the Bishops for the Pan Amazon Region: 6-27 October 2020, Archbishop Bernardito Aza, echoing Pope Francis' concerns, gave a powerful address on protecting and promoting the human rights of indigenous peoples and highlighted their deep spiritual connection to their land. At one point he says:

"The just demand of the indigenous peoples that nothing should be done about them without [their involvement] should be given the utmost consideration."

What is the relevance of this to Australia? Well, here we have the federal government considering the Uluru Statement from the Heart which calls for a Voice to Parliament for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. And why is a Voice to Parliament so important? It's important because it would give Indigenous Australians the recognition, the respect and the authority to have a say in matters that affect them.

The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSSICC) stands in solidarity with the Uluru Statement. NATSSICC calls for constitutional change "to empower our people and allow us to take our rightful place in Australia." See NATSSICC website for a more detailed account.
