# Palm Sunday Rally

Last Sunday we attended the Palm Sunday Rally for Refugees at Belmore Park. The numbers were down a bit on last time but the passion of the participants was just as strong. There were lots of groups represented, the Grandmothers, JRS, Uniting Church, to name a few – and this year a new one, Catholics for Refugees.

Speaker after speaker highlighted the cruelty of our system of treating people seeking asylum. There's one person who's been in detention for 11 years. There's another who's been held for eight years even though her brother and parents are now citizens. They were fortunate enough to have come here before arrival by boat was forbidden.

It was pointed out that:

- The boats stopped long ago because of the turn-back policy.
- The planes have stopped due to COVID and won't start again anytime soon.

That begs two questions: Why do we still treat people seeking asylum as we do? Why hasn't this cruel and inhumane system stopped long before now?

It would be good if lots of us could contact our politicians, of all political persuasions, to let them know that we care, and we want things to change!

# From the Archdiocesan Anti-Slavery Taskforce: Shop for Good

Shop for Good has a Facebook page with information about anti-slavery and suggestions on where to make ethical purchases of a wide range of goods.

Archbishop Anthony Fisher ....) Through [Shop for Good], you can play an active part in combatting modern slavery in contemporary society by purchasing products which are not tainted by slavery and forced labour in their supply chains."

Their latest post has information about how global fashion operates, from *Clotheshorse* website.

Some snippets from the *Clotheshorse* article to whet your appetite:

"Human beings make your clothing. (There is a general misconception that most manufacturing has been automated, done by robots, and that's not true.)

At least 75 million people across the world work in the garment/textile industry, many under forced labour conditions (slavery)

Women from the most marginalised communities in India are paid as little as 15 cents an hour.

Garment workers work 10-16 hours a day, 6 days a week, often in abusive and unpleasant conditions.

The article concludes, "**This post is not intended to make** you feel guilty for having a good life or even buying new things. It's a reminder of why we want to hold brands accountable. It is why we must demand change. We can do this as a community by educating those around us... and becoming louder and louder about the change we want."

The ACM has two sites: the main office is at 77 Buckland Street, Alexandria and the Reconciliation Church at 11 Yarra Road, Phillip Bay (near La Perouse).

The Social Justice Group has established contacts with the ACM. Members of the ACM would love to meet more parishioners and plan to visit us at Mass one day. They asked me to pass on their invitation to share Mass with them.
