150 Days of Action

This campaign based on St Joseph the Refugee started on May 1. It will continue until Migrant and Refugee Sunday, September 26. It seeks to bring together the Sydney Catholic community in a series of concerted actions calling for justice for refugees and people seeking asylum, especially those still in detention. As part of the campaign, the Social Justice Group is looking at ways we at St Columba's can be made more aware of the desperate situation of many refugees and people seeking asylum in this country.

A prayer from the opening ceremony on May 1 provides food for thought:

We hear so few voices of politicians

Who put the safety of asylum seekers first.

We hear so few voices of compassion on the radio waves.

We hear so few voices speaking of people

Displaced by war and torture.

We hear so few voices for a global strategy on asylum seekers.

The voices that speak for these desperate people are too quiet in our community, churches and workplaces.




CWF May Parish Appeal


