150 Days of Action

As we said in last week's Mass Bulletin, this campaign based on St Joseph the Refugee started on May 1. It will continue until Migrant and Refugee Sunday, September 26. It seeks to bring together the Sydney Catholic community in a series of concerted actions calling for justice for refugees and people seeking asylum, especially those still in detention. As part of the campaign, the Social Justice Group is looking at ways we at St Columba's can be made more aware of the desperate situation of many refugees and people seeking asylum in this country.

Here is a poem from the opening ceremony of the campaign on May 1:

JOSEPH THE REFUGEE

You meet him in the street in the old country where his eyes dart into dark corners in case they are watching.

You meet him in the rickety boat at sea, his pockets empty after paying the price of passage.

You meet him behind the barbed wire in the heat as his dreams begin to melt away.

You meet him holding his official letter declaring that he is a refugee, even as he wonders why he remains in detention.

You meet him five years after he foolishly thought he would be released into the community.

You meet him steeling his soul so the hope does not fade.

You meet him emerging from the detention hotel, a little hope reborn.

You meet him as he is told to get a job, after years of not being allowed to get a job. You meet him on the line for the food handouts, his eyes lowered as he clings to his dignity. His name is Joseph.


CWF May Parish Appeal CWF needs your help. COVID-19 has taken an especial toll on the most
