Understandably things can change for availability as weekends approach, I will share the spreadsheet with those who have volunteered and leave one in the



150 Days of Action Campaign for People Seeking Asylum and Refugees

We have mentioned this campaign in earlier Mass Bulletins. As this week's Justice and Peace Office Updates and Activities Email says, ".... inspired by Pope Francis' declaration that this will be the year of St Joseph a number of primarily Catholic organisations have come together to embark on a 150 Days of Action Campaign for people seeking asylum and refugees under the banner of St. Joseph the refugee. The campaign began on the 1st of May (Feast of St Joseph the Worker) and will end on 26 September, the World Day of Migrants and Refugees in the Catholic Church with a Day of Lamentation. Refugee Week Webinar: United for Freedom – Hosted by Vinnies – 23 June 2021


