## Witness K

For those of you following the slow progress of the cases of Witness K and Bernard Collaery cases, the recent relatively lenient sentence of Witness K for revealing state secrets must have been something of a relief. But why were K and Collaery ever charged in the first place when the real culprits involved in defrauding one of the world's poorest countries, who were at the highest levels of government and the intelligence community, have escaped scot-free?

## **Biloela Family**

The government's appalling treatment of this family continues. Fancy giving three-month Temporary Protection Visas (TPVs) to three of the family but keeping Tharnicaa, the younger daughter, in community detention in Perth? It means the family cannot return to Biloela to be with the community that made them welcome.

The treatment of this family is a microcosm of the situation facing all those on TPVs, currently about 30,000 according to the Asylum Seeker Resource Centre. They're all in limbo, never knowing if and when they might be returned to the country they fled. All they can be fairly sure of is that they'll never be allowed to stay permanently in Australia.

As Pope Francis has said: "Migrants and refugees are not pawns on the chessboard of humanity." He was probably thinking about Australia at the time.

If you agree that this situation is very unfair, please contact your local MP and Senators and tell them so.

### Platypus Stole

Charles Balnaves is Parish Priest at St Joseph's parish in



Meredith, a town 100km by road west of Melbourne. He had been involved with the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry (ACM) in the archdiocese for ten years. He wrote of the vestments designed by the

ACM specifically to be placed into his custody on the occasion of his ordination.

A Stole was made for me when I was ordained as a deacon – later modified when I was ordained to the priesthood – this is the stole with the platypus.

A Chasuble and stole was made for me when I was



ordained a priest in 2015. It is based on a story about the Pelican nourishing its young with its own blood. This story is present in many cultures around the world and that includes Aboriginal culture. The stole was commissioned from artist Merrill Bray who belongs to the Eastern Aranda people of Alice Springs at Illbarinja. Her unique contemporary dot paintings express the world around us at 'micro' and 'macro' levels. The first touches the essence of spirit, the intimate vi-

brations which bring into existence the intentions of our thought. The second level evokes the galaxies and clusters of stars. In between, Merrill captures landscapes and seasons, creating new dimensions of space through her use of colour.
