Helen Keller, who went blind and deaf at nineteen months old, said: 'One day I asked a friend of mine who had just returned from a long walk in the woods what she had seen, She replied, "Nothing in particular." 'How was this possible?' I asked my self, 'when I, who cannot hear or see, find hundreds of things to interest me through mere touch. I feel the delicate shape and SPdesign of a leaf. I pass my hands lovingly over the rough bark of a pine tree. Occasionally, I place my hand quietly on a small tree, and if I am lucky, feel the happy quiver of a bird in full song.

The greatest calamity that can befall people, is not they should be born blind, but that they should have eyes, yet fail to see'

- The Climate Change Bill was introduced to the Federal Parliament on October 18th. 




