

RESTRICTIONS – from 15 December 2021



•QR check-ins are still required at

high-risk venues, including places of worship. Prior to entering St. Columba's, please use the Service NSW check-in process with your mobile phone, otherwise our ushers will happily assist to register your details manually.

- •Face masks are required, for indoor premises (subject to exemptions).
- •Density limits have been removed (previously one person per 2sqm).

If you would like to volunteer at St Columba's, please phone the office or write your name on the list in the foyer.


We are requesting the following volunteer positions at each Mass: **Saturday 5pm and Sunday 8am & 10am**.

I was anointed when I was baptised. That means I am like Jesus. I can share his work. Tick what you will do this week to bring good news to someone.




