

UPDATE ON FURTHER EASING OF RESTRICTIONS – from 15 December 2021



•QR check-ins are still required at

high-risk venues, including places of worship. Prior to entering St. Columba's, please use the Service NSW check-in process with your mobile phone, otherwise our ushers will happily assist to register your details manually.

- •Face masks are required, for indoor premises (subject to exemptions).
- •Density limits have been removed (previously one person per 2sqm).

Please continue to observe the following Covid-Safe measures:

- •Please use hand sanitiser before entering.
- •Please maintain 1.5m social distance recommendations where possible inside the church.
- •Please do not join us if you have any Covid-19 symptoms: High Fever (37.5 degrees or higher), a Cough, a Sore Throat, Shortness of Breath (Difficulty Breathing), Loss of Taste/Smell Thank you.


READERS: First & Second Readings, Responsorial Psalm, Gospel Acclamation and Prayers of the Faithful.


A message from the Archdiocese of Sydney


