VOTE FOR THE COMMON GOOD

As we've said in previous Mass Bulletins, the Sydney Archdiocese Justice and Peace Office along with the Sisters of St Joseph have produced a kit entitled "Vote for the Common Good". It covers a number of human rights topics and issues that we as Catholics should consider before deciding how to vote in the coming federal election. Note that the kit is not aligned to any political party and does not tell us how to vote. Most of you would know that, over the last few weeks, there has been an insert in the Mass Bulletin featuring one of these topics. This weekend we continue with the issue of Opposing the Accelerating Wealth Gap. As Pope Francis has said, "Poverty in the world is a scandal. In a world where there is so much wealth, so many resources to feed everyone, it is unfathomable that there are so many hungry children, that there are so many children without an education, so many poor persons."

There's certainly a lot to consider, isn't there?

Saint Rose Venerini: Feast Day 7 May

Rose was born at Viterbo in Italy. Following the death of her fiancé she entered a convent, but returned home to care for her widowed mother. She was a born teacher and decided to follow this path rather than return to the convent.

The free school for girls she opened in 1685 was well received and she was invited to oversee the training of teachers and the administration of schools in her diocese of Montefiascone. As Rose's reputation grew, she was called upon to organize schools in many parts of Italy, including Rome. She often met opposition but was never deterred.

Rose died in Rome in 1728, where a number of miracles were attributed to her. She was beatified in 1952 and canonized in 2006. The group of women who worked with her was ultimately given the rank of a religious congregation - Venerini Sisters, and can be found working among Italian immigrants today.


