

VOTE FOR THE COMMON GOOD

Hopefully, you've been able to read some of the inserts in the Mass Bulletin these last few weeks. They come from the kit entitled **"Vote for the Common Good"**. It was nice to see Monsignor Vince giving the inserts a good plug at Mass over the last two weeks.

As we've said in previous Mass Bulletins, this kit has been produced by the Sydney Archdiocese Justice and Peace Office along with the Sisters of St Joseph. It covers a number of human rights topics and issues that we as Catholics should consider before deciding how to vote in the coming federal election. Note that the kit is not aligned to any political party and does not tell us how to vote.

This weekend we continue with the major issue of **Housing for All.** With interest rates rising this week and expected to continue going up, the housing issue affects a lot of people. Homelessness is now at crisis level, rents are going up (with rental properties becoming increasingly hard to find), and owning your own house has now become an unattainable dream for so many.

Just a personal note: Our two youngest are renting. One son and his partner both have uni degrees and reasonable jobs. They can't see themselves being able to afford to buy a home for a long time to come. It's simply beyond their reach. You can probably appreciate that this is an important issue for us at this election.


