

FUN FACTS ABOUT ST COLUMBA

Columba was born in about 521 in Tyrconnell (now County Donegal), Ireland.

St. Columba was an Irish missionary who is traditionally credited with spreading Christianity through Ireland and Scotland.

He studied at the monasteries of Moville and Clonard and was ordained a priest in about 551.

He is known as Colum Cille or Columcille in Ireland, and Columba is a Latin version of that name.

Columba is now one of Ireland's three patron saints, along with Saint Patrick and Saint Brigid. His feast day is June 9.

He died in Iona on June 9th, 597. After his death, leaders of the Christian church made him a saint.


