NAIDOC WEEK Sunday July 3 – Sunday July 10 Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!

As part of the NAIDOC Week theme of **Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!**, throughout July we'll be highlighting various First Nations issues. This weekend we're looking briefly at the problem First Nations people face in being heard, and specifically on the **Uluru Statement from the Heart** and the **Voice to Parliament.**

The Catholic Social Justice Principle of Subsidiarity teaches us that all people have the right to participate in decisions that affect their lives. Subsidiarity requires that decisions be made by the people closest and most affected by the issues and concerns of the community. Our support of First Nations voices on important issues helps to make Subsidiarity a reality. It is important to note that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples are made up of a diversity of Language Groups and each possesses unique experiences and points of view.

NATSICC (National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Commission) made a submission to the Indigenous Voice co-design process and called on the Parliament to be receptive to a voice from First Nations peoples.

"We believe that people in Australia have good hearts and that we need to appeal to the National sense of giving everyone a fair go to ensure that the Referendum is passed."

"Many people have stated that they need to see the ways in which any Voice to Parliament will help ensure that they have food for tomorrow or that their young son or daughter will make it home safely that day."

"As Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples and Catholics we place our Faith in the inherent good of the Australian people to make an informed and compassionate decision when the time for the referendum arrives."

The Albanese Government has said it is committed to advance the Voice to Parliament with a view to holding a referendum in this term of parliament. What can we ourselves do about supporting the Statement and the Voice to Parliament? Perhaps become familiar with the issues, make sure our family and friends are aware of its importance, and when the referendum is held - vote in support of it.
