

If you have any further questions about your child's eligibility to participate in the Sacramental preparation programs in 2022, please contact Barbara Howard via email <u>pa@stcolumba.org.au</u> or the Parish Office on 9569 2267 On their website, the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) points out that Australia Day is complicated for many First Nations People, and that it might be a long time, if ever, that they feel comfortable celebrating Australia Day on January 26. Many think that moving the date would be a starting point for creating a new dialogue and platform for Reconciliation.

NATSICC itself takes this position, and advocates for Australia Day to be celebrated on May 27, the date in 1967 when Australians voted overwhelmingly to amend the Constitution to allow the Commonwealth to make laws for Aboriginal people and include them in the census.

Our national day provides us all with the opportunity to come together and acknowledge the gifts that our creator has bestowed on this Great Southern Land. But is January 26 still the most appropriate day for this? As Catholics, we are called to action to make Australia a country that more closely reflects our Christian beliefs of equality, respect, and care for our poor and vulnerable. Perhaps we could all deepen our understanding of what January 26 means to First Australians, and indeed what it means to be Australian.

HOMELESSNESS WEEK, 1-7 AUGUST

According to Vinnies, in 2020-21, over 47,000 clients presented to homelessness services in NSW in need of accommodation. But the needs of almost half these clients (48%) could not be met. People were spending longer in crisis and transitional accommodation services because there was nowhere else for them to go. Homelessness Week raises awareness of the impact of homelessness in Australia. This year, the theme is 'To end homelessness we need a plan'. With the housing market failing to meet the needs of so many people in our community, social housing must be part of this plan. You can help continue to help build support for more investment in social housing by contributing to Vinnies' letter writing campaign in the lead up to the March 2023 election. Write to the Premier about why you think homelessness needs to be addressed, and support the call for 5,000 new social housing homes every year for the next ten years. A personal story helps, e.g., your experience or that of someone you know. Please send the letter, addressed to the premier, inside another envelope addressed to Vinnies, who'll make sure it gets to the Premier's office. 


