FIRST NATIONS: AN ALTERNATIVE NATIONAL ANTHEM?

The recent passing of Judith Durham has reminded us of her passion and desire for reconciliation that was expressed in writing alternative lyrics to our National Anthem. In 2009, Durham collaborated with Yorta Yorta musician Deborah Cheetham, Mutti Mutti singer/songwriter Kutcha Edwards, and Yorta Yorta Dja Dja Wurrung woman Dr Lou Bennett, among others, to write new words for our National Anthem. It's a wonderful example of collaboration and listening...

The work was first performed at the opening of the Wilin Week Indigenous Arts Festival, Melbourne, Victoria on April 29 2009, and has received widespread support from First Nations communities.

What's different about these lyrics is that they are inclusive, as can be seen, for example, in the first couple of verses below.:

Australians let us stand as one, upon this sacred land A new day dawns, we're moving on to trust and understand.

Combine our ancient history and cultures everywhere, To bond together for all time, advance Australia fair. With joyful hearts then let us sing, advance Australia fair.

Australians let us all be one, with peace and harmony.
Our precious water, soil and sun, grant life for you and me.
Our land abounds in nature's gifts to love, respect and share.

And honouring the Dreaming, advance Australia fair.
With joyful hearts then let us sing, advance Australia fair.

This version was recently endorsed by such well-known First Nations people as Rugby League player, Latrell Mitchell, and actor, Leah Purcell. In the spirit of reconciliation, the lyrics are well worth reflecting on...
