FIRST NATIONS: ABORIGINAL CATHOLIC MINISTRY TEAMS

DID YOU KNOW:

- There are 133,540 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics in Australia
- NSW is home to over 50,000 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholics.
- A quarter of all Indigenous people in NSW identify as Catholic.
- To support them, there are 14 Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Ministries in Australia.

The Aboriginal Catholic Ministry (ACM) is a service of the Archdiocese of Sydney. It is located at Phillip Bay near La Perouse.

The aim and purpose of the ACM is to promote reconciliation and mutual understanding, as well as taking responsibility for the pastoral care of Catholic Aborigines and supporting them in living out their faith.

The work of the Ministry also provides an interface between all Indigenous people and the Catholic Church. It represents the concerns of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and acts as an advocate on their behalf, as well as providing certain services such as counselling and access to education directed towards practical assistance.
