


NINETEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME 6TH AUGUST AND 7TH AUGUST 2022—Year C

FIRST NATIONS:

UNDERSTANDING CULTURE AND FAITH

On their website, the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) talk about the similarities between Traditional belief systems and Catholic faith. Here is how they describe it:

Traditional culture uses stories to teach about sharing, caring for each other and for the land, and providing moral guidance. For us non-Indigenous people, the stories throughout the Bible serve the exact same purpose - placing God's teachings into our own cultural context.

When early Christian Ministries introduced the Bible to Aboriginal people, the Elders recognised many similarities between the Old Testament stories and traditional stories, laws and the teachings of God (or a creator Spirit). They believed and had faith in their Ancestor Spirit and relied on Him for all their needs. He was their Protector, Provider, Carer and Saviour. His name was honoured.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders are a spiritual people, a people who are aware of the spiritual reality of the land and of their own lives. Their Culture has been in place for over 60,000 years in Australia, and is the oldest surviving culture in the world.

However, there was not a singular 'culture' shared by the thousands of language groups that covered the Australian continent at the time of settlement. Each group had different environments and differing kinship systems, dreamtime stories and spiritual beliefs. There were, nevertheless, constant threads throughout, including the concept of a creator spirit that looks after, provides for, and watches over us.

HOMELESSNESS WEEK, 1-7 AUGUST

Homelessness Week ends this weekend. In last weekend's Mass Bulletin we said how you could support Vinnies' campaign to alleviate homelessness through more investment in social housing. If you would still like to do so, it's not too late. You can still help build support for more investment in social housing by contributing to Vinnies' letter writing campaign in the lead up to the March 2023 election. Write to the Premier about why you think homelessness needs to be addressed, and support the call for 5,000 new social housing homes every year for the next ten years. A personal story helps, e.g., your experience or that of someone you know. Please send the letter, addressed to the premier, inside another envelope addressed to Vinnies, who'll make sure it gets to the Premier's office. If you post it
