SEASON OF CREATION 1st Sept-4th Oct

It's Spring! What a delight it is to see blue skies, flowers blooming, fresh growth in plants. I'm reminded of that famous quote from Keats; "A thing of beauty is a joy forever".

And how apt for us in the Southern Hemisphere for Season of Creation to fall in our Spring! A time when we see visible signs of Creation renewing itself. We each have our favourite examples of the miracles of nature. This is all part of the gift of God's love.

Yet, I know it's sometimes hard to see beauty around us – what a time we're living in! A world that is beset by the horrors of war, increasing natural disasters, the pandemic... Yet in all of this we are called to look, see... Yes, it is hard. Indeed, as Confucius writes, "Everything has beauty, but not everyone sees it."

As Trish Hindmarsh writes in her book, Ecological Spirituality: Caring for our Common Home, "Ecological spirituality calls us to wake up to the bounty and beauty of the natural world we live in, to be awake to God's gift of the cosmos, and to be grateful". And, she explains, it's much more than appreciation. Ecological spirituality "... can equip us to discern where action on behalf of justice is needed, and how to build communities of peace and courage in challenging unjust structures and practices."

In his major encyclical to humanity, *Laudato Si (2015)*, Pope Francis encourages us towards an ecological conversion, a change of mind and heart that can enable us to see with new eyes the preciousness of God's earth and the impact of its abuse. As he wrote in *Laudato Si*:

"This sister now cries out to us because of the harm we have inflicted on her by our irresponsible use and abuse of goods which God has endowed her. We have come to see ourselves as lords and masters, entitled to plunder her at will...."

We are called to reflect deeply on what we as humans are doing to the earth. We are called to respond positively to the call to change both our individual and collective hearts and minds. It's a radical call...one that we need to listen to, and respond with love.

In our bulletin articles over the next few weeks, we hope to provide some thought-provoking articles on care for creation and some ideas about how we as individuals might try to do this.
