SEASON OF CREATION 1st Sept—4th Oct

The annual celebration of the Season of Creation offers an opportunity for each of us to join members of Christian churches everywhere to Listen to the Voice of Creation. We are called to live more intentionally, with greater awareness of the impact of our decisions on earth - our common home. We are reminded of Pope Frances' words in Laudato Si "The entire material universe speaks of God's love, his boundless affection for us. Soil, water, mountains: everything is, as it were, a caress of God." (LS 84)

Together we can be the presence of God, neither consuming nor destroying the gift of Creation, but actively giving voice to that presence through lives lived in gratitude for all Creation's gifts. Living a simple lifestyle boils down to developing an attitude of "enough", reducing waste and seeking alternatives. Living sustainably means we are willing to incorporate environmental actions into our everyday activities. We can reduce our ecological footprint by making mindful choices and combatting the "throw-away" culture.

If we consider Plastic waste: According to the Australian Government's National Plastics Plan, Australians in 2018-2019, consumed approx. 3.5 million tonnes of plastic, the equivalent of about 100kg per person. 84% of plastic used goes straight to landfill and only 13% of all plastic used in Australia is recycled (National Waste Report 2020). One million tonnes of Australians annual plastic consumption is plastic packaging and single-use plastic. These items make up 60% of litter collected in NSW (NSW Gov 2020). Australians use about 70 billion pieces of scrunchable plastics each year: chip packets, food wrappers, bread bags etc. and over 10 million plastic bags every day – 3.5 billion plastic bags annually. Australia is second to the United States in terms of per capita plastic bag consumption.

In Australia approx. 130,000 tonnes of plastic leaks into the marine environment each year. Plastic makes up 84% of the rubbish found on Australian beaches. (The Guardian). An estimated 1 billion disposable coffee cups are used in Australia each year. We throw out 2.7 million coffee cups every day. (University of Melbourne). Australian's buy almost 15 billion plastic bottles every year; many end up in landfill or in our waterways.

What concerns you about the use of plastics? What are some of your recycling practices? Can we adopt better practices and recycling options to reduce plastic waste? A few suggestions: Purchase products with as little packaging as possible. Take our own reusable bags when shopping. Shop at food cooperatives or other food retailers which allow us to purchase only as much as we need. Take our own 'sustainable keep cup' when purchasing coffee and/or ordering hot drinks. 'Red Cycle' by collecting scrunchable plastics and re-cycle these in bins found at most grocery outlets (www.redcycle.net.au). Try to re-use any plastic bags, plastic containers, and recycle what cannot be re-used.

We are called to be mindful of God's creation and do our part to protect our environment. When we appreciate the beauty of creation, we are more likely to act in ways that respect and protect it. Let us take up the challenge offered by Pope Francis to: "cooperate as instruments of God for the care of creation, each according to his or her own culture, experience, involvements and talents." (LS 14)
