SEASON OF CREATION 1ST SEPTEMBER – 4TH OCTOBER

With a continued focus in this bulletin about the Season of Creation, we thought it important to report upon the current developments of the world in relation to progress in tackling climate change.

This past week has seen the interaction of all types or world leaders, first in London for the funeral of Her Majesty, Queen Elizabeth II, and then in New York for the first General Assembly of the United Nations in three years.

The Secretary General of the United Nations opened the week's long discussion with remarks about climate change and a call for wealthier countries to step up and do more about this existential crisis. He states specifically that: "developed economies [should] tax the windfall profits of fossil fuel companies". He also said that it is "high time to put fossil fuel producers, investors and enablers on notice".

On a more local scale, Australia is taking steps towards addressing climate change and the world is noticing. Just during this last week, the European Union stated a desire to agree upon a new trade agreement with Australia due to our country's recent 'positive' policy pivots in this area.

With this being said, there is still much Australia needs to do to address climate change and assist the rest of the world in mobilising an appropriate response to this issue.


