CARING FOR CREATION

Sustainable Fashion Part 2

Last week we gave you a lot of statistics about the amount of clothing we all buy each year, how much ends up in landfill, and about the environmental cost of all this. We then posed a series of questions to consider about our own approach to the sustainability, and so on, of the clothing we buy.

Let's look at this problem from another angle. Sure, we all have a personal responsibility in this area. But surely so do the fashion companies, the retailers, the media companies, and the social media influencers. According to an article in the New York Times, ".... as long as it's easy, fast and cheap to buy fashion then the sustainability aspect ... will always be a secondary choice." The answer, at least in part, is companies being regulated by law to meet social and corporate responsibility targets so that consumers can shop with greater confidence. Maybe we should all be asking our MPs to get moving on this. Furthermore, in Australia a new ethical fashion report that surveyed 120 companies found that just 1 in 10 paid workers in some or all of their factories a living wage. The report also assessed companies on issues such as workers' rights, environmental sustainability, and corporate governance. Permanent Visas for Refugees

The fight for refugee rights continues. Consider these

- There are still 200 refugees stuck on Nauru and in PNG. Some might be accepted in New Zealand but the government is still ignoring most of those in PNG.
- There are 1200 refugees in Australia from offshore (Medevac refugees and families from Nauru.)
- There are 9703 refugees rejected under the flawed fast track process.
- There are about 14,000 refugees still stranded in Indonesia.
