REFLECTION **CHANGE OF HEART**

It is only with the heart that we can repent rightly. Repentance must involve a change of heart. Anything less wont produce a new being. It will be like decapitating weeds while leaving their roots intact. But if we change our hearts, then we will change our lives too.

After his encounter with Jesus, Zacchaeus' heart burst into life like a desert landscape after rainfall.

Fear can't produce a conversion of heart;

only an encounter with love can. Zacchaeus' conversion was a conversion to goodness.

All of us stand in daily need of such a conversion. We need to move from a closed heart to an open heart, from a heart of stone to a heart of flesh.

ULURU

Last Wednesday October 26 marked the return of Uluru to the traditional owners, the Anangu people in 1985. It also marked the ban on climbing Uluru coming into force in 2019.

Uluru is a place of great cultural and spiritual significance for Aboriginal people. There are also many sacred sites in the surrounding Uluru-Kata Tjuta National Park.

The return of Uluru was one of the most important steps forward in the Aboriginal land rights movement. Its further significance can be seen in the use of the name in the Uluru Statement from the Heart due to the landmark's strong connection with Aboriginal Australians.

Permanent Visas for Refugees—Rally 6th Nov

The fight for refugee rights continues. Consider these

- There are still 200 refugees stuck on Nauru and in PNG. Some might be accepted in New Zealand but the government is still ignoring most of those in PNG.
- There are 1200 refugees in Australia from offshore (Medevac refugees and families from Nauru.)
- There are 9703 refugees rejected under the flawed fast track process.
- There are about 14,000 refugees still stranded in Indonesia.


