REFLECTION THE VICTORY OF LOVE

THE ULURU STATEMENT FROM THE HEART

"We invite you to walk with us in a movement of the Australian people for a better future" (The Uluru Statement from The Heart)

What an inspiring invitation! To walk with our Indigenous brothers and sisters...to work together...to build a fairer nation. A copy of the Statement sits in a prominent part of our church, in front of the lectern.

How did the Statement come about?

In order to recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in the Constitution, a Referendum Council was jointly appointed in 2015 by Prime Minister Malcolm Turnbull and Opposition Leader Bill Shorten. The Council consulted widely and its work culminated in the First Nations National Constitutional Convention held near Uluru in 2017. Immediately after the Convention, the Statement was released.

Put simply, The Uluru Statement from The Heart is a petition from First Nations People to the Australian Government. It asks for:

- A First Nations Voice to Parliament enshrined in the Constitution
- The establishment of a Makarrata (from the Yolngu language "a coming together after a struggle") Commission for the purpose of Treaty making and truth telling

We're going to be voting in a referendum about this change in the next 12 months or so, and so we'll be featuring information on this in upcoming Bulletins.

As it says in the From the Heart website, Australians agree that the quality of life for many Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people can and should be better. Governments have struggled to drive real change on many issues like education and health. Giving Indigenous people a real say over these issues because they know what works best for their families and communities — will drive practical change.

A Voice would be a representative body made up of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people from across the

country. It would sit outside the Parliament and provide advice to the Parliament and Government on issues that have a particular impact on Indigenous people. For more info please visit <u>ulurustatement.org</u>

• The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) is pleased to launch our Cross Cultural Competency in a Catholic Context (CCCCC) eLearning Course.

It equips participants with the knowledge and skills to effectively engage with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. At its heart, Cultural Competency is learning about, acknowledging, and valuing the diversity and gifts of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander cultures. On a practical level, Cultural Competence is the ability to work effectively alongside Australia's First Peoples and to make respectful, informed and appropriate decisions across cultural boundaries.

The course takes about an hour to complete and provides participants with information ranging from Colonisation and its continued impact on Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples today right through to practical tips to nurture more genuine and authentic relationships with Australia's First Peoples.







