THE ULURU STATEMENT FROM THE HEART

"In 1967 we were counted, in 2017 we seek to be heard. We leave base camp and start our trek across the country. We invite you to walk with us in a movement of the Australian people for a better future."

This week we continue providing information about the Uluru Statement From The Heart and the Voice to Parliament. We'll mostly use an FAQ format to present this information. The first FAQs are:

Why is Constitutional recognition through a Voice to Parliament important?

• A key feature of a Voice is that it is put in the Constitution. This would recognise the special place of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in Australia's history, but importantly would also mean that it can't be shut down [without another referendum].

• A Voice would be an opportunity to make policies with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people, rather than for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. A proposed representative group of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people would advise the Government and Parliament on how a policy (like rural health) or a law (like Native Title changes for example) would practically and culturally affect Indigenous people.

What will a constitutional recognition deliver?

- It will deliver what Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have consistently asked for - to take responsibility and have input into how government programs work.

- Constitutional recognition through a Voice will give Indigenous communities a route to help inform policy and legal decisions that impact their lives. It's common sense that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people know their communities best and can provide the best feedback on what would work specifically in those communities. Giving people a say will lead to more effective results.

- Although it is not a silver bullet, constitutional recognition through a Voice has significant potential to fix some of the policy problems.

COMING UP THIS WEEK








Christmas Fundraiser


